ECON 201 Principles of Macroeconomics

(3 Credits, Fall/Spring/Summer)

An introductory look at how an economy is measured, the factors of economic growth and development, a basic understanding of money, fiscal policy, monetary policy, and economic philosophy. *(This CWI course meets Idaho State Board of Education GEM competency requirements for GEM 6 - Social and Behavioral Ways of Knowing.)*. (3 lecture hours, 0 lab hours, 3 credits)

ECON 202 Principles of Microeconomics

(3 Credits, Fall/Spring/Summer)

In this introductory course, students will study the price system, market structures, consumer theory, and production costs. PREREQ: Placement into MATH 123. *(This CWI course meets Idaho State Board of Education GEM competency requirements for GEM 6 - Social and Behavioral Ways of Knowing.)*. (3 lecture hours, 0 lab hours, 3 credits)
