Students intending to transfer to Boise State University are advised to take BIOL 227 and BIOL 227L to fulfill one of their GEM 4 requirements. If students don't meet the prerequisite for BIOL 227, they should consider taking BIOL 226 and BIOL 227P instead or they can take MMBS 111 and MMBS 111L to fulfill their additional GEM 4 requirement.
