- Single parents (male or female), including single, pregnant women.
- Economically disadvantaged.
- Out-of-workforce because they have been working without pay to care for a household.
- Youth who have aged out of the foster care system.
- Part of other special populations as defined in the Perkins V grant.

We believe that equitable access to meaningful educational experiences encourages student empowerment, self-advocacy, and the creation of social networks. This improves students' ability to achieve personal and academic goals and enables them to smoothly transition from college to career.
